

Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium Funding

For 2018-19, Trinity received £15,739.

For 2019-20 we will receive £15,652.

The desired impact of the funding is for all Year 7 pupils to be able to access the curriculum in line with their peers.

This is achieved through literacy and numeracy focus groups for underachieving pupils.

These groups are run as early morning sessions (8.30-8.55am) to ensure pupil participation. In addition, pupils are removed part way through lessons to attend a smaller focus group and complete work appropriate to each pupil's needs. This feeds into learning in class and ensures pupils are able to follow the same curriculum as their peers.

Two designated Teaching Assistants are responsible for the co-ordination and delivery of the suggested work and a designated Teaching Assistant is responsible for the delivery and monitoring of the programmes.

Analysis of progress is closely monitored and overseen by the SENCO. Regular assessments allow for comparison to starting points in order to measure impact and monitor progress.
